◆Direct Information from municipalities in Hokkaido

In this segment, we deliver some information that is directly offered from cities in Hokkaido. Maybe you will discover a new side of Hokkaido.

If you'd like to see beautiful canola fields, we have some good information.

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Takikawa Nanohana Festival

Takikawa is one of the largest planted nanohana (=canola) areas in Japan and its beautiful sight attracts a number of tourists from in and out of Japan.

Lands of Takikawa turn brilliant yellow from the middle of May to the end of the month every year. Temporary tourist information center will be open for about a week during "Nanohana-week". You can ride on "Nanohana-taxi" and travel from one end of Nanohana fields to the other during the week. Canola fields need crop rotation; therefore, you can survey a different and great view of the flowers every year. Temporary tourist information center will offer foreign language assistance. You can get city information as well.

Canola blooms for 7 to 10 days and only once per year. Please visit to see the beautiful "Nanohana-fields" which Takikawa city boasts to the world.
