In 1950, Hokkaido Women's Medical College was reimagined as the first institution in the new medical university system established after the war, opening its doors as Sapporo Medical University.

We began with only the School of Medicine, but in April 1993, we opened the School of Health Sciences, consisting of Department of Nursing, the Department of Physical Therapy, and the Department of Occupational Therapy. In April 2007, we took the step of becoming a Hokkaido Public University Corporation.

Today, we are a comprehensive medical university with approximately 1,300 undergraduate and graduate students and 1,600 teachers in our two schools and four departments.
